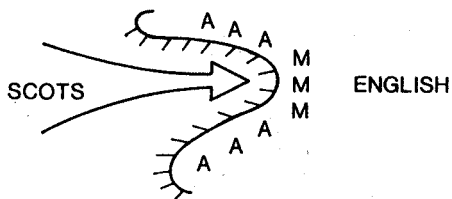

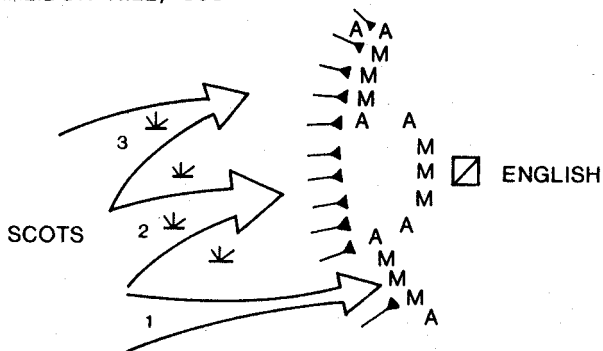

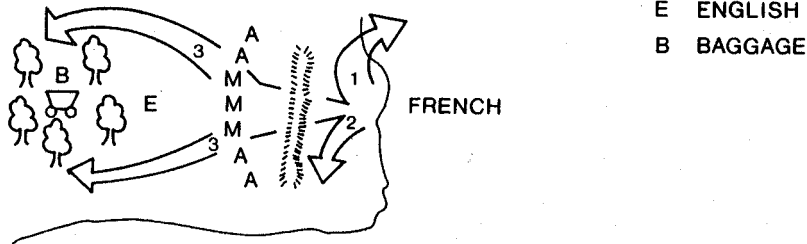

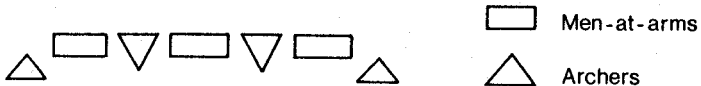

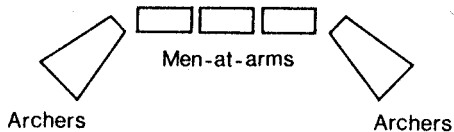
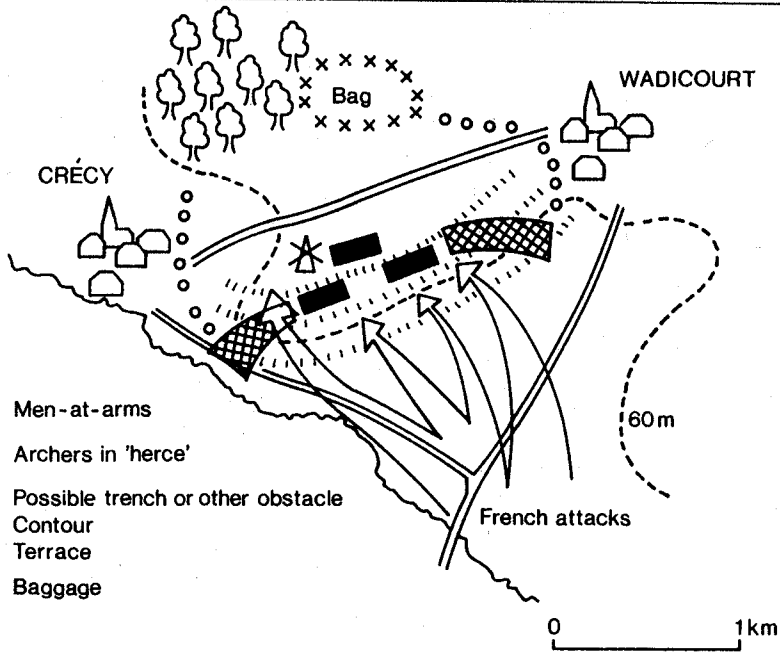


Fig. 1.4 'Herce' formation according to A.H. Burne and J. Bradbury.

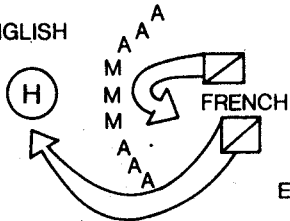

Fig. 1.5 Crécy, 1346 (Burne's topography).

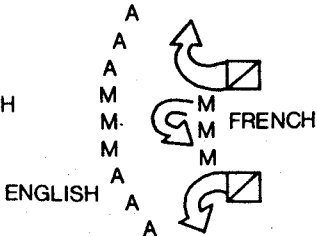

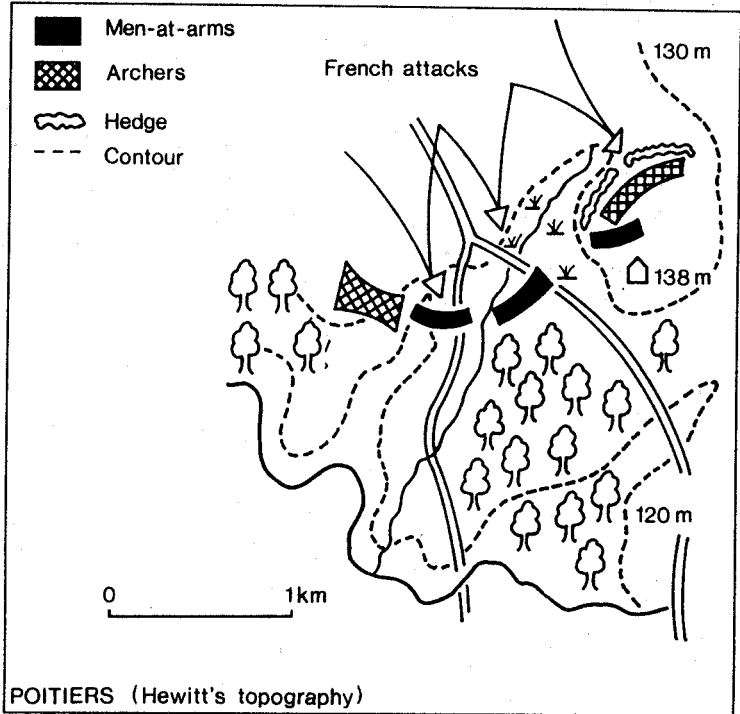


Fig. 1.9 Poitiers, 1356 (Hewitt's topography).

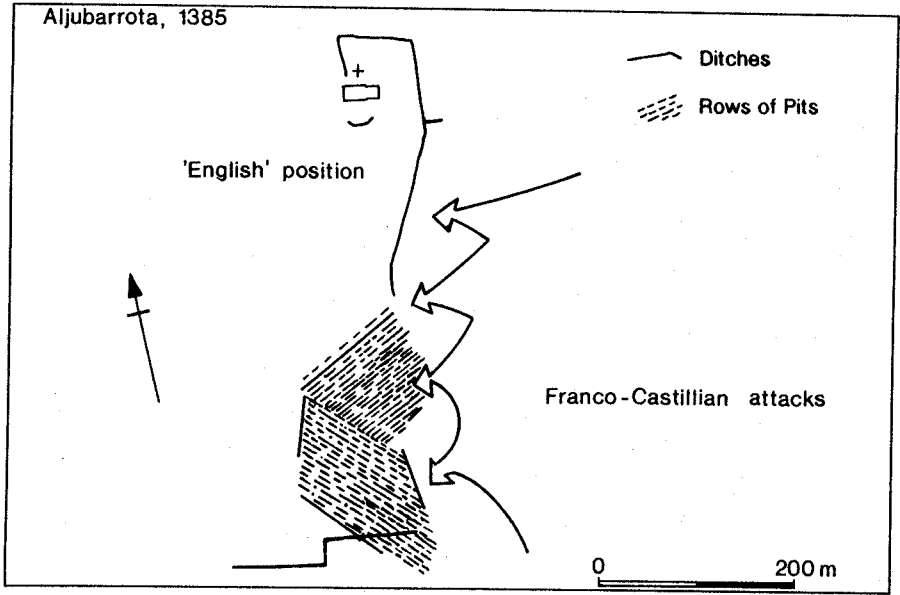


Fig. 1.10 Aljubarrota, 1385.

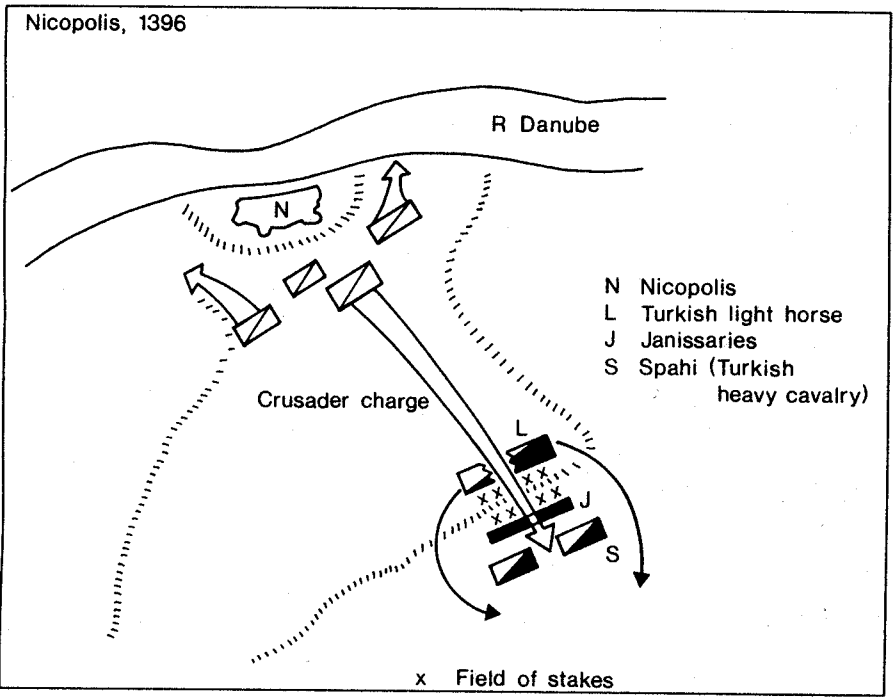


Fig. 1.11 Nicopolis, 1396.

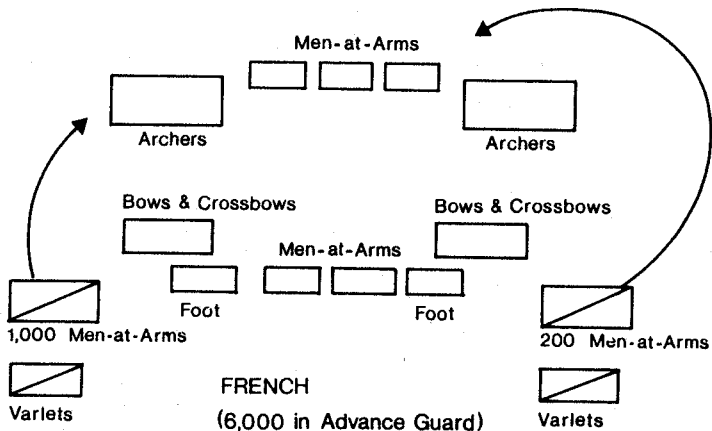
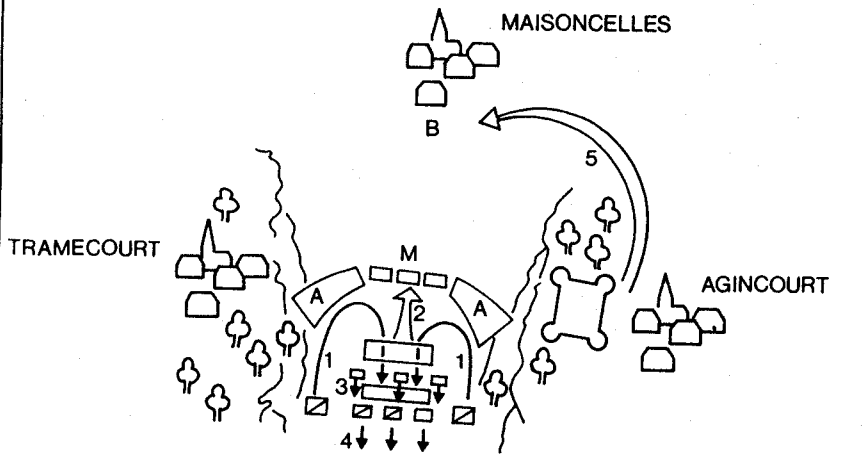


Fig. 1.12 Marshal Boucicault's plan for the Agincourt campaign.

Fig. 1.13 The battle of Agincourt, 1415.

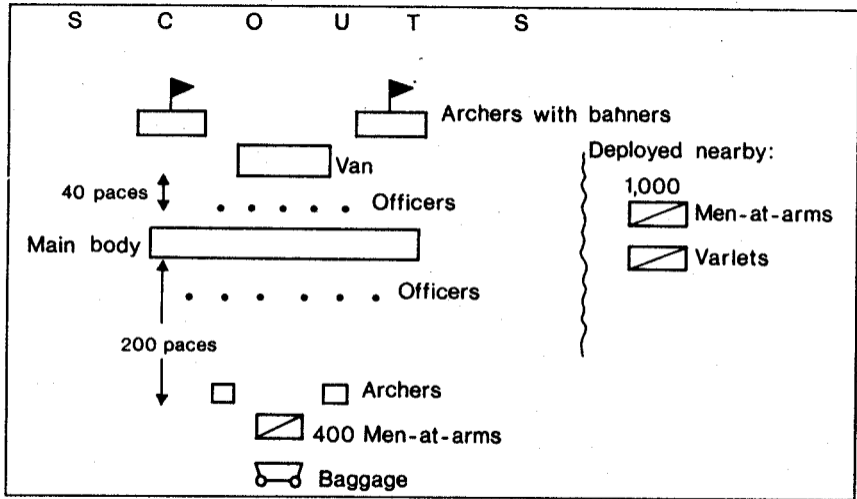


Fig. 1.14 John the Fearless' *Ordinance* of 1417.
